Authenticity

Assessed work must be the students' own work. Students and their caregivers are expected to sign authenticity declarations and, where appropriate submit drafts of their work. Where evidence indicates work presented is not the students' own work the school policy will be followed, i.e. Not Achieved for that assessment.

Attendance

Students are expected to attend class on a regular basis as set out in the school policy on attendance. If there is a record of consistent non-attendance which could jeopardise the safety or achievement of the rest of the group, then an alternative place of learning will be considered during PE lessons. It is the students' responsibility to catch up on work that has been missed due to non-attendance. If an assessment is missed a **Doctors Certificate** must be presented to enable students to re-sit the assessment.

Participation

Students must **participate in 85%** of the theory and practical activities of this course to be eligible to do the assessment.

Appeals

Appeals against assessed grades awarded should be made following the procedure outlined in the school policy on appeals. Students wishing to appeal a grade must do so within 48 hours of receiving notification of their assessed grade. Graded work is **not** to be removed from the classroom.

Late Work

Late work will **not** be accepted for assessment, unless exceptional circumstance exists, (computer failure is not a valid reason to hand work in late) and an extension will be given by the teacher. Extensions must be applied for **three** days prior to the assessment due date.

Verifying Grades

Students will be required to verify the grades they have been awarded by signing the result slip attached to each assessment.

Compassionate Considerations

Compassionate consideration for students who are absent from an internal assessment may be made if there is sufficient evidence available from other work related to the same skills/contact and no other re-assessment opportunity is available.

Retention of Student Work

The Department will retain all work completed during this course.
