Course Aims

This course aims to support students with their English language studies or with their different NCEA subjects. Students may work on extra study for their various curriculum subjects, research or assignments for NCEA, or use the class to do extra English study.

Description of Course

Topics will be chosen by the student working together with the ESOL teacher. Students will have access to the ESOL computers and may do research, reading, writing or other work for their various NCEA subjects. Junior students may do activities on the computers such as listening or extra reading in English. They may also work on the Athletics programme. Students will have the support of an ESOL teacher who will help them to understand and complete work for NCEA assessments in their different NCEA classes.
